## **Youth Commission Report**

Lucy Gagliardo presented annual request for budget funding. They are requesting \$8,113 from the town for 2006. She handed out a letter to the board and program information. The program serves middle and high school aged kids.

## **Highway Superintendent's Report**

Paved South Rd. from Camp McCormick to the county line with hot mix. The edge of the road was breaking off, and it was dangerous, especially with the speeds people travel up there. The patch should last two winters. Both Groton and Danby helped out with a truck. Sealed Middaugh, Banks, and Snyder Hill. Had a junk clean up; technically you're only supposed to have one every three years, but because other towns didn't take advantage of it, Caroline was able to have one two years in a row. When the town holds a clean up every year, items trickle in, which is better than having to deal with large amounts. Only three other towns will be shouldering this year, and they're starting with us. Doing Middaugh, part of South Rd, and spots on Buffalo Rd. Superintendent provided the list of seasonal use roads.

## Report

• Boiceville Road – need to see about fixing the bridge before spring flooding

- Documents for land swap with CU are at CU; no response in the past month
- HAVA and charge back new law; county will be responsible for all voting. All towns do things differently, so they need to work with the towns to figure out a protocol. County has passed resolution for the towns to pay in 2006 what we paid in 2004, then to reduce each year until the fifth year, when we pay nothing. This is for all but charge back. The issue of charge backs is unresolved since it doesn't show up in anybody's budget. It's raised by taxes and shows up on individual tax bills. (What we pay for inspectors, renting election facilities).
- WRC appointment, ITCTC Planning Committee appointment need to be made
- Road Patrol: Need people to speak at county budget public hearing 11/9. Legislature has agreed to one new deputy. Looking for people who feel strongly to go to hearing to share experiences about the detrimental effects of not having enough coverage.

## Department, Committee, & Liaison Reports

#### Councilman Goodrich

All the topsoil is graded back on to the staging areas. Seeding will be done by soil and water as soon as it's dry enough. The equipment has gone back. There were no personal injuries or equipment breakdowns during the entire project.

#### **Councilman Schmit**

Passed around the updated budget summary for Barrille. All grant money except \$639 is spent. We can expect one more round of hired labor expenses, plus some pumping and engineering expenditures in the amount of \$18,000 to \$20,000. Working on getting more funding through soil and water and the city. Under budget on large stone, but medium called for \$10,000 more that what was in our design. More hauling than expected also. Next week the scouts will start their plantings. Construction manager reported that the fuel pumps belonging to Griffith Energy were stolen; Sheriff was supposed to file a report. Supervisor asked Schmit to contact Jeannie at the Bailey Agency to file a claim. Sent last of documentation to get \$115,000 from IO. \$70,000 reimbursement from CCAP forthcoming by end of year.

Two workshops held at Town Hall sponsored by Cayuga Lake Watershed Network end of September were very well attended.
