Privilege of the Floor

Youth Group Presentation: The group put together a calendar that represents our town; profits go to meal program at the food pantry, which members will work at for several weeks this winter. They also presented an album of extra photos that did not go into the calendar. They'd like to keep the calendar in the reading room. They received a grant to put up posters about risks of drinking, which they will put up at the food pantry, and for a program they will present at Dewitt middle school about dangers of alcohol. Members worked at the Apple Fest and also decorated the Community Center for the Halloween party.

They put a series of questions to the board and were answered as follows:

- Mackenzie park: what are we planning to do with the space? Will consolidate on the Town Hall side of the street, incorporate development over here.
- Timeframe? Within the year; we'll consider what kind of park space we want.
- What is the money they gave us being used for? Collecting interest.
- Insurance issues for the new park? There are guidelines, will need modern, safe structures
- Costs of new park? No idea yet.
- Will they move the space? Yes
- What will happen to the old space? Try to sell property. Notice has been posted.
- How to encourage people to use the park? Bigger question we'll want input on, including from the youth group.

The supervisor asked about calendar sales. They sold at Dewitt middle school, Cooperative Extension, Apple Fest. Earned \$300 so far.

Madison Wright: Gave presentation about an invasive species of plant we call "bamboo." He calls it "Japanese knotweed." Perennial that grows up every season and dies every winter. Grows best out in the open where it goes undisturbed. Forms clumps that are so dense they crowd everything out; clumps get larger over time. No coordinated effort in the state to control its spread. Must first find out where it grows now, mostly along the roadways. He approached Superintendent Whittaker about doing a local survey. Provided a map of Caroline and a set of pushpins and asked the crew to put a pin in the map at each site where they found it growing. Has done this for two summers and there was lots of growth found. State does not provide money to get at it or the legal means to go onto someone else's property. One thing we can to now: earth moving contractors and highway workers have a powerful influence on the transfer process, and if they learn to recognize it and not dig near it, they will do a lot in preventing the spread. He presented the map to leave at town hall for a few days, and some leaflets from Cooperative Extension.

Report

- Midnight Sun: Closing occurred on Monday 11/7. Would like to discuss engineering analysis of the structure and cleaning up the exterior before winter.
- Property across the street: date that town board can proceed with negotiations for selling this property is 11/24. He recommends a letter be sent to the adjacent property owners telling them that the town is interested in selling, and asking their interest. Also stating that the parcel could be subdivided if the neighbors are interested in cooperating on a new property line.
- Through Cornell land swap, the town now owns the 30+ acres of land on Bald Hill School Rd. Suggest that we get an appraisal on this parcel and then go through the same process as we're following on the former MacKenzie Park. Not to exceed \$600 from NE appraisal. Board agrees.
- Code Enforcement Officer Lee Knuppenburg had exploratory surgery to discover source of pain in abdomen. Operation and recovery took a lot out of him and he's still not back to work. Working with Dryden to cover the basics for now. May need to hire an assistant.
- Went to a civil service workshop and discovered that once the Code Enforcement job required more than 20 hours/week, it became competitive, requiring a civil service exam.
- TCMOA meeting 11/15 at 6 p.m. at Icabod. Supervisor will not be able to attend, so asking if Councilman Cope will.
- Council of Governments: Introduction of topic 11/16 at 2:30 p.m. on the 2nd floor conference room of the courthouse.

WHEREAS, in order to be eligible for this grant program, the applicant must submit a formal resolution of the governing body indicating support for the grant application, designating a representative authorized to act on behalf of that body in all matters related to this financial assistance, and specifying how funds solicited through the program will be used, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, on recommendation of the Caroline Planning Board, That the Caroline Town Board supports the preparation of the Comprehensive Plan including its implementation strategies for the Town of Caroline, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Caroline Town Board authorizes Donald Barber/ Town of Caroline Supervisor, or his designee, to submit an application to the Department of State Quality Communities Program 2005-2006 for Environmental Protection Funds to support the preparation of the Comprehensive Plan and its implementation strategies for the Town of Caroline, as part of a Community Growth Program, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Caroline Town Board authorizes the Town Supervisor, or his designee, to execute all financial and/or administrative processes relating to this financial assistance, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that funds solicited through this program will be used to prepare the Comprehensive Plan and its implementation strategies for the Town of Caroline, as part of a Community Growth Program, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Caroline will commit at least 20% of the total project cost in match.

Town Business: Structural Analysis of Midnight Sun

Matthew McCarty gave Councilman Seely a proposal for a structural analysis on the Midnight Sun; the estimate was \$1200. We can find out the integrity of the building now, but in the future, when we do actual work, we would need to do this anyway, so the issue is, do we want to wait?

Discussion:

Schmit: First we need to evaluate our needs for a building; then we decide whether we'll try and use the building or build a new one.

Barber: Would be willing to spend the money now; we've already discussed what we want out of a building, and we could go into the design phase knowing if any of the structure is salvageable, so we make use of the space we've got. We can then make the design fit what we already have, or go in knowing we need to raze the building. Money is not set aside in 2005 budget. If we're not in a hurry, we could invite proposals from A&E firms for structural AND initial design. We'll need three bids, so need to publish it.

Barber asked whether anyone was interested in putting together a work party to clean up the lot; we can get Cindy Whittaker to help with the big stuff. Tim Seely will rustle up some help.
