Presentation US Postal Service

Donna Marotto discussed the relocation of post office in Slaterville. 30-day comment period follows. First step is to look at existing buildings, if can't find one, will look for sites. She will advertise for sites and work with a committee to choose. Committee will include current postmaster, architects, engineers, etc. They want 770 square feet and a 20-year lease, during which they pay taxes. USPS will either do the interior work themselves or have locals build to spec. Current building coming down due to poor structural integrity. Preferred area is within hamlet limits. She encouraged anyone with comments to write or call her.

Duane Scott: Representing rural students at Ithaca High in committees with school and justice department; several community forums coming up, and they're looking to see changes in the ICSD. Introduce Draft Local Law

A Local Law of the Town of Caroline, State of New York, Providing for a Partial Tax Exemption for Real Property Owned by Persons with Disabilities Whose Incomes Are Limited by Reason of Such Disability

Section 2 of Local Law No. 5 of the year 2000 of the Town of Caroline entitled "A Local Law of the Town of Caroline, State of New York, Providing for a Partial Tax Exemption for Real Property Owned by Persons with Disabilities Whose Incomes Are Limited by Reason of Such Disability," as amended by Local Law No. 3 of the year 2002, and further amended by Local Law No. 1 of 2004.

Real property located in the Town of Caroline owned by one or more persons, each of whom is disabled and whose income is limited by reason of such disability, or real property owned by husband and wife or siblings, one of whom is disabled and whose income is limited by reason of such disability, shall be partially exempt from taxation by said Town for the applicable taxes specified in Section 459-c based upon the income of the

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owner or combined income of the owners. Such partial exemption shall be to the extent set forth in the schedule following.

Less than or equal to \$27,000	50%
Equal to or more than 27,001 but less than 28,000	45%
Equal to or more than \$28,000 but less than \$29,000	40%
Equal to or more than \$29,000 but less than \$30,000	35%
Equal to or more than \$30,000 but less than \$30,900	30%
Equal to or more than \$30,900 but less than \$31,800	25%
Equal to or more than \$31,800 but less than \$32,700	20%
Equal to or more than \$32,700 but less than \$33,600	15%
Equal to or more than \$33,600 but less than \$34,500	10%
Equal to or more than \$34,500 but less than \$35,400	5%
Equal to or more than \$35,400	0%

This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State and for assessment rolls prepared after such effective date.

Resolutions

Resolution 1-33 of 2008 Support for Coddington Trail Initiative by the Natural Areas and Trails Working Group

By Supervisor Barber; Seconded by Councilman Frongillo

WHEREAS, at the December 2006 meeting of the Caroline Town Board the *Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Caroline* was adopted unanimously; and

WHEREAS, "Open space enriches our lives and adds ecological, social and economic value to our community. Caroline's open space encompasses many different areas of the landscape that have not been built over, including.... pathways and trails... Protecting and enhancing open spaces provides value for residents and is an essential ingredient of quality of life in Caroline" (Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Caroline, 2006, p. 11); and

WHEREAS: Trails provide an important recreational outlet and stated goals of this plan include, "Preservation of existing protected open space, and pursuit of additional opportunities for public open space and recreational amenities, particularly close to population centers." (Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Caroline, 2006, p. 10); and

WHEREAS, Trails built to bicycle riding standards provide alternative commuter routes, reducing traffic on local roads; and

WHEREAS, Trails support the public health of communities by providing opportunities for residents to engage in physical exercise; and

WHEREAS, stated goals of the Town of Caroline Comprehensive plan include establishing "Pedestrian ways and bikeways between Slaterville, Brooktondale, and Ithaca, especially the Coddington, Six Mile Creek, and Besemer trails." (Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Caroline, 2006, p. 13); and

WHEREAS, one of the "nine main approaches, which over the next five years will move Caroline toward fulfilling the Comprehensive Plan's goals" includes "Establish the Natural Areas and Trails Group", charged to "Develop pedestrian trails and bikeways between Slaterville, Brooktondale and Ithaca. The first priority of this group and a reasonable five year goal will be to secure an easement for the Coddington Trail that will connect Brooktondale, along the old railway bed, to the South Hill Recreation Way at Burns Road, locate funding and begin construction." (Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Caroline, 2006, p. 23); and

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WHEREAS, the Natural Areas and Trails Group was convened in April 2007 by Kathleen M. Quinlan, a former *Planning Board* member, at the request of the *Planning Board*; and

WHEREAS this group of ten citizens has the long term vision of establishing a trail/path extending the South Hill Recreation Way through Caroline to Owego along the former Lackawanna Railroad bed, with a trail spur that connects to the hamlet of Brooktondale along a route yet to be determined) and has accomplished the following relevant background work during the spring, summer and fall of 2007:

- 1. Met six times for discussion and planning;
- 2. Hosted the following invited speakers to learn of the history of successful trail establishment in Tompkins County, specifically focusing on background information to understand the issues involved with establishing the South Hill Recreation Way:
 - George Franz, project manager during the planning and construction of Ithaca's South Hill Recreation Way
 - Rich Schoch, Park Maintenance Manager, Town of Ithaca Public Works Department (in charge of maintenance for Ithaca's South Hill Recreation Way)
 - Fernando De Aragón, Executive Director, Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council (ITCTC)
- 3. Attended several related meetings, including the May 2007 Southern Tier Trails conference;
- 4. Has had informal conversations with others in Tompkins County with experience related to trail development;
- 5. Has walked two specific sections of the proposed path (Banks Road to Burns Road, and Burns Road to Middaugh Road) (led by an individual with permission to access the property);
- 6. Has determined that this extension runs through four Towns in Tompkins County (Ithaca, Dryden, Danby and Caroline);
- 7. Has determined that this extension would provide a valuable bicycle commuter link between the Town of Caroline and the City of Ithaca, if construction to the bicycle path design standards of the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) were completed;
- 8. Has determined that the segment between Burns Road and Banks Road could link to the west edge of the Hamlet of Brooktondale and is highest priority for bicycle- standard construction; that the segment from Banks Road to Beaver Creek would significantly enhance bicycle accessibility from the hamlet of Brooktondale by bringing the trailhead closer to the center of the hamlet, although construction would be much more costly along this second section due to current trail conditions.
- 9. Has determined that the extension overlaps the Finger Lakes Trail east of Ridgeway Road, providing a link between the Finger Lakes Trail (and, in turn, Shindagin Hollow State Forest and Hammond Hill State Forest) and the City of Ithaca;
- 10. Has determined that the land along the proposed extension belongs to New York State Electric and Gas (NYSEG):
- 11. Had determined that neighboring landowners will need to be involved in discussions early in the trail planning process;
- 12. Has determined that this trail is not currently on the Tompkins County Planning map for trail development within Tompkins County;
- 13. Has determined that county grants are available for a feasibility study if a trail is on the Ithaca Tompkins County Transportation Planning map for trail development;
- 14. Has determined that putting the trail on the Ithaca Tompkins County Transportation Council Planning map requires a formal request from the affected towns (Ithaca, Dryden, Danby and Caroline);
- 15. Has determined that there are at least two options for grants for trail construction to a bicycle standard, with anticipated deadlines of June 2008 and September, annually;
- 16. Has determined that a requisite for success in winning state and federal grant applications for funds for trail construction is that a right of way for trail use be established before grants are awarded;
- 17. Has determined that a requisite for success in winning state and federal grant applications for trail construction is inclusion in relevant government plans.

WHEREAS the *Natural Areas and Trails and Working Group* has presented the background of their work to the *Town of Caroline Planning Board* on December specifically outlining their long and short term goals, as well as specific challenges associated with this project (6, 10, 12 in particular, above); and

WHEREAS The Town of Caroline Planning Board unanimously endorsed the resolution that:

- 1. The Town of Caroline be the governmental agency providing leadership and momentum for this project;
- 2. That the initial steps be:
 - a. Coordination with the three other affected towns (Dryden, Danby and Ithaca) to make a formal request to the Ithaca Tompkins County Transportation Council that the extension of the South Hill Recreation Way along the former railroad bed be included on the Tompkins County Transportation Planning map and be granted feasibility study funding for the trail segment from Burns Road to Banks Road.
 - b. Negotiations with NYSEG for a right of way for the entire length currently under their domain in Tompkins County; and
- 3. That a member of the Caroline Town Board, separate from the liaison to the Planning Board, be appointed with the responsibility to act on the Town's behalf, and speak for the Town Board, in this coordination with other Towns, the County, and NYSEG, working in close association with citizens of the *Natural Areas and Trails Working Group*;
- 4. That the pace of negotiations be such that it is realistic for the *Natural Areas and Trails Working Group* to apply for state grant funding for construction with a June 2008 deadline.

WHEREAS the Caroline Town Board received an oral presentation on the background to this project and its goals at the December 2007 board meeting, now therefore let it be

RESOLVED, that The Town of Caroline be the lead agency in providing direction and momentum for this project, acting with the *Natural Areas and Trails Working Group* to establish shared goals with the Towns of Ithaca, Dryden and Danby in the establishment of an extension to the South Hill Recreation Parkway to the hamlet of Brooktondale;

And Be It Further Resolved that Linda Adams, a member of the Caroline Town Board, has the responsibility to conduct negotiations and discussions on behalf of the Caroline Town Board with the *Natural Areas and Trails Working Group*, other Towns, the County, NYSEG, and landowners in a timely manner so that the Town Board can apply for state or federal grant funding with a June 2008 deadline.

Discussion: Trails are owned by NYSEG. Must get permission from property owners for right of way to access trail. This resolution enables someone from the town to negotiate with NYSEG; trails group can't make a commitment on behalf of the town since the board is the legal entity. Town of Ithaca and Black Diamond Trail have agreements with NYSEG. Ms. Adams offered to lead negotiations.
