Harold Phoenix: Needs to get the Magistrate's association dues paid so he can get his 35-year pin. Clerk will send certified mail tomorrow, if necessary.

Department, Committee, & Liaison Reports

Frank Proto, County Legislature

Grievance day for tax assessments: 5/14 from 3 to 6 pm. Final assessment role due at end of May. Formal assessment review board occurs at the end of May or beginning of June. If it's a clear error, you don't have to bring comparatives and appraisal.

WIC program: there will be a WIC program; the issue is who will be the organization that delivers the program. No other entity has applied to deliver the program. RFP has yet to come out. County not sure they want to apply. State will decide who will deliver the program. Very well-used program, and a good bang for the buck. Very efficiently run. If the program moves, concern is for all the other support programs, if health dept moves up by airport. This is a transportation and efficiency issue because of the impact on all these families who use the programs. There are 8 employees with the WIC program now, and have to find positions for these employees within the county structure if this program leaves. Problem is that county passed a resolution not to apply. Concern is the budget. Total hit to the county is under \$20,000, and not worth putting everything at risk for that amount. And in 28 years, not one other agency has applied to deliver it. In moving to the new building, there is a lack of space to administer all the services.

TCAT: considering lowering fares to increase ridership. State Transit Operating Assistance (STOA) fund reimburses for mileage and bodies riding the bus. So increasing ridership brings in more money.

SPCA: supportive of continuance with them.

Resident Bernie Clark has a relative who died and was a Korean War Vet. His name is not on the monument on White Church Rd. Maybe town could find out who is missing from monument.

Highway Superintendent

Mr. McDonald gave the report for Cindy Whittaker.

- Trees have been removed in Ogden Circle
- Patching gravel roads and paved rds, cutting brush continuing
- Upcoming: Ridgeway and Level Green.
- Junk week successful: over 10 tons to solid waste; also two pickup loads to Salvation Army. Got over \$2500 for scrap. Bills for \$2352 for cartage fee for midnight sun demolition. Highway dept will use the concrete.
- Temporary sign stands were stolen from the highway dept.
- Talking with county about getting generator from one of the towers; would have to be converted from propane to natural gas. Will not have to pay for this generator.
- Highway department closing from May 26 to June 2.
