Privilege of the Floor

Sam Trechter – In support of Trail. Benefits our community. Dangerous to bike on 79 & Coddington Rd. Exercise/Recreation benefits. Adds to green space utilizing non-motorized transportation. Safe travel corridor.

Diane Hamilton – In support of Trail. Child afraid to ride bike on road. Diane voice to younger generation with children that want the trail. Keep trail conversation open. Positive economic benefit.

Kevin McGuire – In support of Trail. Consistent with recreation, transportation, environment, & economy. Lived here since 2013.

Hollie Kitson – Pro Trail. Bike Commuter. Roads can be dangerous. Trail provides safety.

Marie Cope – Co-Owner Brooktons Market but speaking personally in support of trail. Lived here since 2011. As a real estate agent thinks it would improve property values.

Cal Snow, Town Board – Slave Burial Ground and Ellis Hollow Rd. dedication are an ongoing discussion. Lenny Whittaker retired from the Highway Department today. He Started in April 1981. Beautification/junk cars. Cal to speak with Code Enforcement Officer re: junk cars. Contract negotiations ongoing. Memorial Day/cemeteries. Cal to connect with Town Historian, Barbara Kone.

BROADBAND UPDATE

Broadband - IW and MW met with Lee Haefele on Apr 20 afternoon, then committee meeting that evening. Reviewed Haefele map of Round 2 grant award and areas identified by State as unserved and eligible for bids for Round 3 funding which has just opened. Haefele will consider applying for Round 3 funding to build out Fire Tower Rd area, but may need additional support from residents/town to cover costs for doing so. Other areas not w/in reach of Haefele backbone. Conversation w/State BB office — Charter/Spectrum is required to bid on all areas not yet covered, but State not obligated to award funding to them. So, we may still have areas left to cover after Round 3. Clarity has offered that they may be able to help with that. Committee will circulate petition to unserved households indicating interest in getting BB service to hopefully attract Charter/Spectrum or other vendor's interest.

PHONES

Town Hall Phone System – discussed and will research Office 365 based Skype and other online VOIP business solutions. Probably much more cost effective than getting new in house PBS server and phone system.

Cell Service – Dryden just approved Verizon Tower. Interest is seeing if we can get Verizon to locate here.

Internet of Things – may be able to provide "text" service locally even if no cell coverage. IW met with Jon Bosak and Terry Moore (MCCI) to discuss possible applications for IoT network in Caroline.

AQUIFER PROTECTION

We met Apr 5, reviewed latest comments from GK and SW. Developed replies – sent back to SW. Next meeting May 3rd. Q's about what training/qualifications are needed to determine if aquifer contamination is a concern at a specific site, and who would be responsible (DEC, Soil & Water, Code Enforcement Officer) and who has authority to do this?

TCCOG

Gov's shared services proposal discussed. Soon a meeting of Town Supervisors, Mayors, County Admin to ID project for approval this fall, to begin in Jan 2018.

Continued discussion of Solar PILOT proposal IDA is considering. Also, discussion of Broadband for rest of County.

CCA meeting – (Community Choice Ag) NYSERDA Rep advance policy for CCA. Sustainability, getting renewables to market. Discussed challenges facing.

Town Business

Meeting procedure/etiquette. Desire to allow flexibility while maintaining consistency is important. Privilege of the floor is for addressing the Town Board, not to argue a point to other members of the public. Don Barber contributed explicit details of the process and running of Town Board meetings and "privilege" of the floor. Authorization to sign mowing contract for Town Hall & cemeteries. Address lawn clipping during droughts or otherwise unnecessary. Add a hold clause to language in contract. Discussion of feasibility assessment of Town Barns. Cost & proposal. Heating system for Historic Town Hall. Enroll in HeatSmart program. Receive energy assessment and bids with no cost nor commitment. Caroline Town Hall location invited in consideration for electric charging station.
