Supr. Witmer opened with the Pledge to the Flag.

# Privilege-of-the-Floor

Chad Novelli – Spoke in favor of zoning.

Barbara Baird – Spoke in favor of zoning.

Rebecca Schillenbeck – Spoke in favor of zoning.

Shawn Malarcher – Spoke in favor of zoning.

Pete Hoyt – Shared his disagreement of how the draft law was constructed.

Bill Podulka – As a member of the zoning commission, he is in attendance tonight to offer support to the Board as they review the draft law. Disagreed with their decision to lower the 50' buffer to 20' for intermittent streams and asked that they reconsider.

Bruce Murray – Also a member of the zoning commission. Agreed with the modifications made to the draft at the last session. Added that the Board keep in mind that the DEC has their regulations set at a 50' buffer.

## **Committee Reports**

**Hwy. Supt., Bob Spencer, Highway Report** – Mr. Spencer was not present at tonight's meeting but submitted a report (Attachment #1 herewith) and which report was read aloud by Supr. Witmer

**Clm. Snow** – *highway* - Attended highway school earlier this week. Workshops attended included CHIPS allocation of money, and stormwater mitigation. *Cemeteries* – grounds were mowed over Memorial weekend. The Morris Chapel Cemetery (Middaugh Rd) needs some attention. Looking for volunteers to help with minor restoration and mending of headstones.

**Dan Klein, County Legislator Report** – *Broadband* – County study showed approximately 1100 homes do not have internet access. An RFP for buildout has been paused as they have now asked their consultant to research what it would take to develop County-wide broadband services. Once that information is collected, the Legislation will then vote on which option to move forward with. *Tax Foreclosure Auction* – The Supreme Court law has changed the process. They are awaiting word from NYS on how to proceed. There are currently 7 properties in Tompkins County that are on hold for now. *Asylum Seekers* – No record of arrival of any seekers yet. The County has worked internally and developed a plan for services should they receive families.

## Discussion of Draft Zoning Law (Article V, Section 5.3 continued; Article III)

The following 4 motions were made:

<u>Motion 1:</u> Revise the amended streambank buffer of 20' back to the original recommended buffer of 50' for intermittent streams.

By: Witmer – 2<sup>nd</sup> Kelley-Mackenzie

PASSED (unanimous)

Motion 2: make the maximum extent for perennial 200 feet when wetlands and/or steep slopes are in play in all districts except hamlets; 150 feet within hamlets.

By: Witmer - 2<sup>nd</sup> Kelley-Mackenzie

PASSED (Opposed: Snow)

Motion 3: to modify text of 5.3.4 (as revised at last meeting) as follows:

- 4. Each application for a Building Permit, Special Use Permit, Subdivision, or Site Plan Approval within a Stream Buffer shall furnish sufficient a site or subdivision plan showing the boundary of the Water Overlay District and locations of all building envelopes. Whenever a building envelope cannot be sited outside of the buffer area due to lot configuration, lot size, or other natural features, the Review Board may require site specific stormwater management or other strategies to prevent or minimize adverse impacts on the water body. The Review Board may require additional data to demonstrate that the proposed activity will not result in any of the following impacts:
  - 1. Alteration of Aquifer capacities.
  - 2. Reduction of flood-carrying capacities of watercourses or increased hazards associated with flooding.
  - 3. Deterioration of water quality or impairment of best usage of waters.
  - 4. Alteration of water retention capabilities; increase in siltation of surface water bodies and adjacent areas.
  - 5. Significant Disturbance to fish and wildlife populations and natural plant communities.
  - 6. Impairment of any natural function of a Wetland or its adjacent Buffer area.
  - 7. Alteration of the flow pattern of a watercourse area.
  - 8. Increase in the velocity of surface water runoff.

By: Witmer - 2<sup>nd</sup> Murray PASSED (unanimous)

Motion 4: Change wording from "pervious" to "gravel" on page 69/3e.

By: Kelley-Mackenzie – 2<sup>nd</sup> Witmer PASSED (Abstain: Kelley-Mackenzie)

Supr. Witmer noted that the definition needed to be revised to "buffer area inner" to "buffer area outer".

Lastly, Clm. Murray reviewed and announced all the hamlets and summarized how the commission came to identify those districts. The board studied the Town map and discussed the hamlet boundary lines.

The next zoning discussion is set for next Thursday, June 15, 2023, at 7:00 PM
