# **Dominic Frongillo, Town Board**

The Town Board Planning committee will be participating at the February 15 meeting to inform their work on the Critical Environmental Areas and Industrial Site Plan Review.

Response to Don Barber's remarks of 1/11/11

Be informed that I will continue to speak my mind on all matters affecting town governance, including where relevant, participation or lack thereof on the part of other board members. #### Linda Adams, Town Board

Watershed Report Feb. 2011

Four families have contacted the Watershed Committee about bank erosion they are / have been watching on their property. Some for several years, not new occurrences per say. Field visits will be scheduled come spring. Barry Goodrich and Soil & Water will take a look, come up with some recommendations for the families.

John Daniels is working with a resident that is currently in violation of our Local and NYS storm water laws. John expects full compliance to be this month February, he is getting good cooperation.

Craig Schutt (TWSD) reported to the W-shed Committee that the State is auditing MS4 compliance. Typically, the State informs the municipality of such an audit. Special focus is on the MS4 section having to do with Illicit Discharge Detection. Barry Goodrich confirmed he is hearing similar talk about discharge being a favored topic, how discharge is mitigated, plans a/o practices a municipality can show for proactive past / future actions. Together the Highway Dept. and W-shed Committee will be working to maintain our good record.

FL-LOWPA funding supports projects and water quality assurance works in Caroline. A brief yet impressive listing was submitted to Tompkins Soil & Water District to highlight the 2010 year. This is part of a constant effort to remain accountable for public funded results.

Feb. 15th, 7pm, Caroline Town Hall: Caroline Recharge Areas. Caroline Planning & Caroline Watershed will have a joint meeting with Todd Miller of USGS.

Future business- in March the W-shed committee will be discussing options for measuring the water quality of the spring in front of the Town Hall. We plan on having costs & options into the Town Board for their consideration during one of the April Board Meetings. Steve Penningroth of CSI and Tompkins Health Dept. have good criteria to offer Caroline.

Topic: FL-LOWPA Resources, Town of Caroline

To: Craig Schutt of Tompkins Soil & Water District

Now that we are in the beginning of 2011, it is appropriate to look back on the value of the support FL-LOWPA resources have for the Town of Caroline and Tompkins County. It would not be an overstatement to say these resources maintain Caroline's compliance with a number of Local & State requirements as well as keeping Caroline in a proactive stance on water related issues. FL-LOWPA supported initiatives:

- a) Six mile Creek Water Quality Monitoring, the source for a 1/3 of Ithaca City's drinking water
- b) Brooktondale Gage Station, located on Six Mile Creek, the 24/7 real time data record is a foundation of stream project designs, scientific worthy data, and a method to measure / quantify investment in water life cycle management
- c) Natural Channel Stream Stabilization Construction 2005, project completed in 2005, a small flood plain was created having proven it is mitigation value in several high water events protecting agricultural property, preventing erosion sediment negatives, & protecting a bridge on a main thoroughfare of Rt. 79
- d) Natural Channel Stream Stabilization Construction 2010 project completed in 2010, both bank & stream bed erosion has been stabilized; a shallow aquifer's confinement layer protected, this artesian aquifer supplies the drinking water to Slaterville Springs, NY and it is connected to the dynamics of a deeper aquifer supplying more homes with domestic water-a local grade school-as well as a spring located in front of the historic Caroline Town Hall accessible to folks since our Great Grandparents days.
- e) Valley Road Bank Stabilization 2010, largely a County project that has successfully mitigated the eventual loss of a County road into Six Mile creek due to bank erosion
- f) Preferred Pasture Area Creation, an initiative that allows for the relocation of cows out of a low elevation tributary buffer, to higher ground with fencing & solar powered water supply for livestock
- g) Disturbed surface hydro-seeding, one of the best examples of shared municipal resources, improved response time scheduling, superior growth / coverage site measures of hydro-seeding on disturbed surfaces such as ditching, stream construction, and storm water mitigation projects

In the summation: The Town of Caroline could not tackle the examples above without the professional staff of Tompkins Soil & Water which in turn is able to perform because of FL-LOWPA funding. Their professional expertise during planning and field oversight is clearly not a scope a rural Township such as Caroline can cover. FL-LOWPA resources give us access to Tompkins Soil & Water staff that are capable of interfacing with FEMA, the Army Corp of Engineers, SEMA, DEC, and an almost infinite list or water & soil agencies & NGO's.

Is FL-LOWPA a primary contributor to tangible results base investment for the greater good- Yes!
