Caroline Town Board Meeting Minutes of May 10, 2011

The Town Board Business meeting held on May 10, 2011 at the Caroline Town Hall was called to order at 7:10 p.m. by Supervisor Don Barber.

Privilege of the Floor

Jonathon Comstock 114 Bald Hill School Rd. Brooktondale, NY - Addressed the board about hydraulic fracturing. He said that he was sure the board was aware of the activity in other towns: Ulysses, Danby and Ithaca. All of the aforementioned towns have activity going on in terms of trying to formulate town level legislation that would ban hydraulic fracturing. Jonathon asked the Caroline town board to join in this effort to keep the Caroline lands free of extreme industrial activity. He stated that he believed "the practice to be unsafe, fraught with accidents, which will cause localized pollution, long-term pollution of water, ground water in general. It is also associated with very intense air pollution, which is very predictable." He also said that in addition to legislation that would affect the Town of Caroline, the Dept of Environmental Conservation is accepting public input up until this Saturday (May 14th) on the draft plan for the "Rapid Waters Management Unit" which covers both Danby and Shinndagin Hollow State Forest. "It is a beautiful plan for the first 100 pages talking about the integrity of the forest; leaving it in better shape for future generations. There is other ecological sentiments that talk about how they are going to do that and then it talks about windmills and how unsightly they are and why they should not be allowed because they could fragment and cause ecological harm. They talk about hydraulic fracturing wells with a platform that goes up to 8 acres. It is not a leasing agreement built into the plan but more of statement that they are hoping to do this type of leasing into the future." Jonathon submitted a letter to the DEC signed by 200 residents (which most signatures were from Caroline (see attachment 1),) asking the DEC to remove the option of leasing of State Forest lands from their final draft. He gave the Town Board contact information for the DEC and urged them to send a notice asking the DEC to not allow hydraulic fracturing in the forest in Caroline

Mary Alice Kobler, 114 Bald Hill School Rd. Brooktondale, NY – Addressed the board about hydraulic fracturing. She said she was sure everyone is aware of the petition circulating against unsafe shale extraction in the Town of Caroline. She stated that she lived in a quiet residential area of Caroline, she had a large engaging job, and she also has extensive gardens so she is at home a lot. The industrializing of our neighborhood had her "very stirred." She does not believe there is a safe way to "hydraulically fracture" our countryside as well as the high scale industrialization that will happen so she asked the board to honor the wishes of their constituents because in "giving up her Saturdays and going from door to door" that she found it is an issue that unites all of Caroline. "It cuts through all socio-economic, ideological boundaries," is what she hears from people, and what feels the Town board will hear soon from their constitutes that they don't want the industrialization of the countryside; of the beautiful rural landscapes. "We don't want the truck traffic or air pollution. People know about it now and they don't want it. Some people stand to gin financially from this, and for some people our land is not for sale. Some people have leased and didn't know what they were getting into, but the vast majority of Caroline say 'no.' We are asking the Town board to be on board and back us on that position." She said she was here today to ask the Town board to please back them on this issue.

Bruce Murray – Bald Hill Rd. Brooktondale, NY – He inquired if anyone had asked about getting a permit for the proposed cell tower on Ball Hill Rd. Don Barber answered that no one had inquired about getting a permit application. Bruce said he had gone on-line and researched about the health hazards if you lived in an area within a ½ a mile from a cell tower. He asked if it comes time for the application process for a cell tower that the board look at some of the studies about these health hazards. He also said that the hydraulic fracturing on State lands

he is against too. He said "the land belongs to the people" and he doesn't understand how the State can think about leasing it for this project. He said the State law prohibits the use of 4-wheelers on State land as they are too "intrusive" to be used on State land, but drilling is okay, which makes no sense to him. "If 4-wheelers are that intrusive then what do they think truck traffic will be like?" He said the petition he was aware of against the drilling collected over 1000 names and he was wondering what the Town could or should do in support of this petition. He is in hopes that the board will look at this issue "long and hard" and take into consideration how many people signed the petition; the number of people in the town vs. how many people have signed it.

Dave Buckner, from Dewitt Middle School, Ithaca, NY.- He is the Technology Engineering teacher at Dewitt Middle School and he and his students are looking for a community service project. They were here to give a presentation to the Town board on replacing the front steps and landing/deck (for the 2nd front door) on the Historic Town Hall. Dave works with Penny Boynton who gave them the idea of replacing the front steps that had been in such bad shape that they were removed.

Esther, Diego, Lindsey, Ashta (sp?) are part of the Technology Student Association (TSA) which participate in State and National events where they are judged on the work projects they complete. The group is in competitions across the country. They based their design (CAD drawing) for the steps and deck from the design of the other front door steps and deck. The material they use will match the other steps and deck (that are in front of the other front door at the Historic Town Hall.) They will use pressure treated lumber, (5'x5' for the deck) to match the design that is already there on the other doorsteps and railings. The materials will cost ~\$875.00 (quote from Cayuga Lumber) and they will need to rent an auger for drilling the holes for the posts; 8 inch holes 4.5 feet down. (Mr. Aaron Snow offered that he has a 6 inch auger that the group could possibly use if that size would work for their project.). The TSA group is also looking for funding for the materials. They plan to start the project near the end of May.

Linda Adams, Town Board

Barry Goodrich and Jon Negley performed a water issues field reconnaissance May 4th.

-Tom Whittaker case: backyard stream bank erosion; Barry & Jon showed Tom where and how to plant willow stakes \sim 3" in diameter; for best results this must be done in the next 8 weeks so the plants can take root stabilizing the bank; the sooner the better, Tom is willing to do so & pleased with the fix

-Cindy & Scott Whittaker case: erosion issues water contributed from Lenard Road run off is a factor; Tompkins Soil & Water will draw up a mitigation plan, details were agreed upon with a walk about with the property owners, main solution will be a small wall - back fill to the wall - plantings, work that the property owner can do themselves, they are pleased with the plan

-Joe Lychalk, Phil & Mary Terwilliger case: bank erosion near Boiceville Bridge; the County will take care of this area since it is impacting the bridge, Soil & Water will report the field situation to the County with several tips from Barry on how to fix the stream reach for a lasting result, firstly remove some debris piles

-Evie Weinstein case: bank erosion threatening her driveway bridge; Soil & Water and Barry have been to this area several times, Barry will make recommendations for an excavator to carefully & precisely relocate some large trees now fallen in the stream, these will act as natural structures diverting the stream flow through the exact middle of the bridge thus eliminating the current "taking" of soil from the banks, Barry will make an appointment to go over the details with Evie.

Ron Jones case: Barry spotted a good location for a french drain which will divert much of the water problems away from both homes but still keep the water to that property's boundries, Soil & Water will draw up the design and share the concept with Ron at a future date (Ron was not home), Barry spoke with the next door neighbor who has lived there for 2 decades knows of only one or two occasions when the cross pipe on South Rd had its carrying capacity exceeded, that pipe is doing a great job do not mess with what is working.

Town Business

Sub division review committee

Interview- Cordell Geissinger

Cordell was born and raised on a farm in PA. He came to Caroline in 1967, in 1972 he built his house in Caroline had lived there ever since. He worked at Cornell University and retired 15-16 years ago. He worked in research as a technician in plant pathology 5 and $\frac{1}{2}$ years. Has been an alternate for the sub-division review committee so he has never has "sat in" on the meetings. He said having been raised and living in the country he doesn't want to see country disappear or the farmland.

Discussion and Action Topics:

- The board discussed that to comply with the DEC that there needed to be an appeals process in place for the Flood Plain law.
- There was a discussion with the Town Board and the Town Clerk about the minutes and working to streamline the process.
- Collective bargaining unit- Toby McDonald gave an update on talking with the teamsters representative and the highway dept employees about the new contract that will run from 1/1/2011 to 12/31/2013. The teamsters produced the contract using language from the previous highway employee contract with changes in pay schedules, creation of a new tier (which includes changes in vacation pay, sick leave, and a contribution of 10 percent toward health insurance)- (this new tier includes anyone hired after 1/1/2011.) Other changes in the contract is health insurance, which is now through the TC Health Care Consortium.
- Supervisor Don Barber talked to the board and explained the process of the Road Excavation and Construction Permit fees schedule (before proposing the resolution to adopt the permit fees schedule.) Dominic Frongillo asked if the resolution could be updated (as needed or required to meet the needs of the Town.) Don answered that the resolution could be updated at anytime. Highway Supt, Cindy Whittaker and the Code Officer, John Daniels are working closely together to insure the process runs smoothly.
- State Forest leasing for Gas drilling- The board discussed the pro and cons, and decided as individual Caroline citizens if they felt so compelled should address this matter, but not as a part of the Town Board as a member or as a whole. Their function as a board to was not to take sides in these types of matters.
