Resolution 219 of 2014

Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) on Environmental Assessment for Dominion Transmission

A motion was made by Mark Witmer and seconded by Tim Seely

Resolution on Scope of Issues for Environmental Assessment of Dominion Transmission, Inc. Proposed New Market Project (Docket #14-497-000): Evaluate best course.

Whereas, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) has solicited public input on the scope of issues that FERC should address in the Environmental Assessment for Dominion Transmission, Inc.'s proposed New Market Project,

Whereas, climate change is underway as a result of human combustion of fossil fuels (IPCC,2013),

Whereas, positive feedbacks exist in which products of atmospheric warming (water, methane, ice melt) lead to further warming (Howarth 2014),

Whereas, thresholds at which positive feedbacks would produce unavoidable global warming and climate chaos will be reached within the next several decades on our current trajectory (Howarth 2014 and references therein),

Whereas, methane use as an energy source produces more greenhouse gas emissions than other fossil fuels because, in addition to carbon dioxide emissions that result from combustion, substantial methane, a potent greenhouse gas, leaks during mining (primarily hydraulic fracturing) and distribution (Howarth 2014).

Whereas, emissions of volatile organic compounds, like benzene and formaldehyde, from compressor stations are associated with health impacts on residents living near compressor stations and pipelines (Madison County Department of Health 2014: symptoms associated with proximity to compressor stations include throat irritation, severe headaches, frequent nosebleeds, confusion, and skin rashes; effects of chronic exposure to VOCs of compressor stations include nervous system damage, anemia, leukemia, liver, kidney, heart, and lung damage, and mutagenic effects on fetuses).

Whereas, renewable energy sources exist that can provide our power needs and reduce our greenhouse gas emissions: solar, wind, and hydro-power are viable energy sources (Jacobson et al. 2013),

Whereas, impacts of energy policy will affect energy availability, climate effects on private properties, town infrastructure, and quality of life for residents of Caroline and other localities,

Therefore be it resolved that the Town of Caroline questions whether it is good strategic energy policy to build out fossil-fuel-distribution infrastructure in light of objective evidence that this would accelerate global warming and resulting climate change. We call on the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to conduct a full Environmental Impact Statement that carefully and comprehensively evaluates the cumulative impacts of the proposed New Market Project (Docket # CP14-497-000) in these critical respects:

- Does the New Market Project contribute to an effective energy policy the curbs GHG emissions to levels that will avoid climate tipping points?
- What are the cumulative environmental impacts of the New Market Project compared to viable alternatives, like renewable energy technologies. This analysis must include a full life-cycle perspective of GHG emissions, including mining, transportation, storage, distribution, and usage, and should evaluate local impacts to residents adjacent to compressor stations and pipelines, as well as regional and global impacts.
- What are the quantified health risks, both local and global, associated with methane pipelines and compressor stations?
- What are the health costs resulting from compressor station emissions of methane and other volatile organic compounds?

And further it be resolved that the Town Clerk sends a certified copy of the resolution to the DEC.

Senator Schumer, Senator Seward, Gilabrand, Assemblywomen Lifton, President Obama, the EPA and

the Public Service Commission.
